

Diálogos Clase Metro y Alrededores

Vocabulario para revisión:

A continuación, te presentaremos un probable diálogo para atender a las personas que buscan información sobre el Metro de la Ciudad de México.

TURIST: What is the cost of the subway ticket?

POLICE OFFICER: The cost of the ticket is five pesos.

TURIST: And what is the cost of the metro card?

POLICE OFFICER: You can buy a card for 20 pesos, it already has one trip included. If you need to recharge it, there are machines available, or you can go to the metro ticket window.

TURIST: And if the turnstile reader doesn't recognize my card when I swipe it. What should I do/can I do?

POLICE OFFICER: You can check your situation with the station chief.

TURIST: And how do I transfer from this station to this station?

POLICE OFFICER: It's very easy to move from one station to another. There are maps with all the metro lines at each station, and if you find the names of the stations difficult to pronounce, you can use the images of the stations as a guide. You can also download the app: Mi metro CDMX.

POLICE OFFICER: You can also use your contactless bank card to enter the metro.

But it must be a Mastercard or Visa, and you can only use it once, and you'll have to wait before your next trip to avoid double charges.

TURIST: Thank you very much, officer.

POLICE OFFICER: You're welcome, take care.
